

Craterium aureum (Schumach.) Rost.


Date 19 Nov. 2012 (0368) & 1 Sept. 2013 (0367). Black Sugarloaf (big tree track). Habitat Closed wet Eucalypt forest. Substrate wood on underside of small dead eucalypt branch. Description scattered stalked sporangia, 1.1 mm tall, pale lemon yellow and white. Sporotheca obovoid (wider and flattened at base) 0.4–0.5 mm x 0.5–0.7 mm wide. Stalk subulate, longitudinally grooved, 0.5 mm, yellow. Hypothallus discoid, yellow. Peridium white and limey with wrinkled patter in upper part; yellow at base. Dehiscence irregular leaving 'cup' with ragged rim. Capillitium large irregular yellow with some colourless threads. Spores brown in mass, pale by transmitted light faintly warted, 7–8 $\mu m.$ Notes: Only two collections, both collected from the same substrate at far end of track near bryophyte-covered logging ramp. Fits description of Craterium aureum (page 229) in N.E N.-B. (1991).
