

**Date:** 11 March 2014. Black Sugarloaf (big tree track).

**Habitat:** Closed wet Eucalypt forest.

**Substrate:** Very large eucalypt log (big tree log).

**Description:** Scattered stalked nodding sporangia 0.8–1.2 mm high. **Sporotheca** globose, yellowish, 0.2–3 mm diameter.

**Stalk** thin, reddish brown, lighter at apex, (brown in transmitted light) 0.6–0.9 mm long; 3–5 x diameter of sporotheca. **Hypothallus** discoid under sporangia, reddish, shiny. **Peridial net** has small ribs connect to triangular and rectangular meshes; nodes conspicuous, rounded with pale brown 1–2  $\mu\text{m}$  diameter granules and several free ends. **Spores** ochraceous in mass, pale by transmitted light, minutely spiny with groups of darker spines, 6–7  $\mu\text{m}$ .

**Notes:** More or less fits the description in Nann.-Bemek. (1991). Similar in size to *C. microcarpa* but has different coloured stalk and shape of nodes. See *Cribraria cf. microcarpa* #0444.
