**Date** 1 Sept. 2015. Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (Thismia Gully). **Habitat**: Closed wet Eucalypt forest.

**Substrate** lichens, moss and wood on fallen *Acacia melanoxylon* log. **Description** crowded and scattered sessile, globose to sub-globose sporangia, 1.2–1.6 mm diameter, flesh pink, mottled. **Hypothallus** inconspicuous, membranous, shiny. **Sporotheca** globose to sub-globose sessile sporangia, 1.2–1.6 mm, flesh pink. **Peridium** fragile, flesh pink with some marbling, layers not conspicuously differentiated, dehiscence irregular. **Columella** globose with buff coloured outer layer, white inside. **Capillitium** detached from peridium, dark with white tips by reflected light, brown with pale ends and some membranous expansions. **Spores** black in mass, dark brown in transmitted light, lighter on one side, densely spinulose, 12–15 μm.

**Notes**: Matches description in Poulain *et al.* except for size (larger than 0.5–1 mm) and substrate—on log not leaves.
