Date: 10 Sept. 2013. Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (big tree track).

Habitat: Closed wet Eucalypt forest. **Substrate**: Bark of living *Eucalyptus obliqua*.

Description: Scattered stalked sporangia 1.5 mm high. Sporotheca subglobose, 0.7 mm diameter, purplish brown patches on ochraceous yellow background. **Peridium** double with dark brown patches over lighter coloured background, amorphous particles in patches and in stalk; dehiscence 'petaloid' or circumscissile in some sporangia leaving a distinct cup. Stalk ²/₃–³/₄ total height, subulate, longitudinally furrowed, shiny, red brown. Hypothallus like an extension of stalk, contiguous under sporangia. Capillitium some threads attached to inner surface of peridium, ochraceous in mass, pale brown by transmitted light, simple with faint spiral bands, 3 µm diameter, free ends rounded, some ending in a long 7 µm spine. **Spores** mustard yellow in mass, pale by transmitted light, minutely warted (spinulose?), 7-8 μm. Notes: matches description except for conspicuous hypothallus. Two collections only; both from the same substrate collected a week apart.
