Date 24 June 2014. Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (big tree track). **Habitat**: Closed wet Eucalypt forest.

Substrate: Decayed wood on ground. Description Several scattered stalked sporangia 1-1.6 mm high. Sporotheca subglobose (wider than high) 0.8-0.9 mm wide. Stalk approximately ½ height of sporangia, slightly grooved, wider at base, black and shiny. Hypothallus contiguous under groups or discoid, thick, black with a silvery sheen. Peridium delicate, breaks in irregular flakes and persists at base of sporotheca. Iridescent with golden and blue reflections (much more intense blue than other Lamproderma spp.). Columella reaches to approximately 1/4 of sporotheca, rounded at tip. Capillitium arises mainly from tip of columella, simple, branching and some anastomosing, brown with branched pale free tips. Spores dark brown in mass, brown by transmitted light with short spines 14–15 μm. **Plasmodium** white 'beads'. Notes stalk longer than description and substrate is wood not moss. Ref: Poulain et al.
