Date 30 March 2013. Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (swamp)

Habitat: Melaleuca ericifolia swamp forest.

Substrate Eucalypt log.

Description tiny stalked sporangia scattered among sporangia of *Physarum viride*, 0.6–0.8 mm high. Sporotheca globose, 0.15–0.2 mm diameter. Stalk approximately ¾ height of sporotheca, black by reflected light, reddish brown by transmitted light. Peridium persistent and iridescent in some sporangia with blue and golden reflections, dehiscence irregular leaving small collar at base of sporotheca. Columella reaches approximately ⅓ of sporotheca where it branches. Capillitium branches from columella, no anastomoses with tapering ends. Spores dark brown in mass, light brown by transmitted light, warted with patches of darker warts, 6–9.5 μm. Notes Keys out to this species in Poulain *et al.* (p. 492). (Sporangia may not be scattered among MEL collection of *Physarum viride* #273.)
