Date 4 Jan. 2017. Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (big tree track). **Habitat**: Closed wet Eucalypt forest.

Substrate large old eucalypt stump (big tree stump). Description three scattered sessile hemispherical to pulvinate aethalia, $16 \text{ mm} \log x 12 \text{ mm}$ wide x 8 mm high, dark brown changing to reddish brown when dry. Hypothallus conspicuous, extending beyond margin of aethalia, silvery white. Cortex cartilaginous, slightly bullate, reddish brown with silver marks, cracking and falling away. Pseudocapillitium consists of threads and membranous perforated plates. Spores reddish brown in mass, pale yellowish brown by transmitted light, banded-reticulate on about $\frac{2}{3}$ of the surface, $6-7 \text{ }\mu\text{m}$.

Notes: This species is not common (or easily overlooked?); 9 Nov. 2014: 2 aethalium collected from eucalypt log in Thismia Gully. 5 Jan. 2017: 3 small aethalia collected from a small eucalypt stump at home.
