**Date** 2 Sept. 2014. Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (Thismia gully). **Habitat**: Closed wet Eucalypt forest.

Substrate wood and moss on large bryophyte-covered eucalypt log. Description large groups of crowded stalked sporangia, 2–2.6 mm high, yellow. **Sporotheca** turbinate to pyriform, 0.6–1 mm diameter. Stalk black, longitudinally grooved, 1-1.3 mm long and gradually merging into sporotheca, filled with spore-like cysts. Hypothallus membranous, contiguous under group, yellow brown. Peridium shiny, membranous, fugacious in the upper part leaving a deep calyculus with a torn rim at dehiscence. Capillitium formed of simple ochraceous yellow elaters with smooth spiral bands tapering to long slender tips, 6 µm diameter. Spores yellow in mass, pale by transmitted light with scattered warts  $11-13 \ \mu m$ . Notes: Keys out to Trichia decipiens but it is yellower and has longer stalks than other collections. Substrate different to usual T. decipiens substrate and sporangia were white when they first appeared rather than bright orange or pink.
