Badhamia affinis Rostaf.

Date 4 Sept. 2016 Black Sugarloaf, Birralee (big tree track). **Habitat** Closed wet Eucalypt forest.

Substrate Standing dead *Bedfordia salicina*. Description Gregarious short stalked sporangia, 0.6–0.9 mm diameter. Sporotheca globose to sub-globose, white. Stalk short, some procumbent, dark brown, grooved, 0.2–0.3 mm long. Hypothallus inconspicuous. Peridium encrusted with white lime, dehiscence irregular. Columella absent. Capillitium white tubules, some branching. Spores dark brown in mass, lighter brown by transmitted light, some with pale line, 12–13 µm.

Notes Keys out to *B. affinis* in N.E. N.-B. except the pale line on the spores is not described. However, it is mentioned in description of *B. armillata* which is 'possibly no more than a variety [of *B. affinis*]'. The pale spore line is included in description in Poulain et al. and illustrated in Neubert et al. The texts do not describe the groups of darker warts.
